OVERVIEW

NFMC's Strategic Initiatives Program (SIP) is intended to assist local First Nations, municipalities and industry to bring forward eligible, forestry-related projects that develop capacity and promote, attract and support economic growth in the existing and emerging forestry sector. Projects should:

- Respond to local economic opportunities and challenges
- Address priorities and pursue regional collaboration to advance common goals and strengthen the forestry sector's competitive advantages
- Enable innovation and research to maintain the health and vigour of NFMC's forest landscape

WHAT IS ELIGIBLE UNDER THE PROGRAM?

Eligible projects must meet one of the objects as set out under the Ontario Forest Tenure Modernization Act (OFTMA). Eligible projects must be located on the Pic or White River Forests and may include, but are not limited to:

- NFMC will only support Start-up of new businesses or Expansion of existing businesses(replacement of current equipment is NOT eligible).
- Capacity-building and investment opportunities consistent with the NFMC's Strategic Plan and the OFTMA
- Sector-based research projects that align with the NFMC's Strategic Plan or initiatives
- Capital investments in harvesting or silviculture equipment that help meet annual allowable harvest levels or support NFMC's silviculture program on NFMC forests
- Training for new employees in the forestry sector regarding health and safety, road building and harvesting training
- Other non-capital projects that promote or support economic growth and provide benefits to the local forestry sector
- Projects intended to identify capacity building and investment opportunities are only considered for funding when the applicant demonstrates the ability to support next steps in project implementation (i.e. through a business plan).
- Equipment cannot be purchased in advance of NFMC grant approval

ELIGIBILITY

Eligible applicants must be a First Nation, community organization or forestry company within or surrounding the NFMC management area. Eligibility is conditional on the project or initiative being implemented within the management area.

FUNDING

The amount of NPMC assistance per project will generally not exceed the lesser of 50% or \$1 million of total eligible initiative costs, and is not intended to replace other sources of funding.

Not all proposed projects meeting SIP criteria outlined above will receive funding. All projects must fit within the annual budget allocation for the program.

In exceptional circumstances, the NPMC Board may consider projects exceeding the normal levels of assistance on a case-by-case basis whereby a project demonstrates a significant benefit to NPMC and its objectives.

Applications will be reviewed quarterly and a complete package must be received a minimum of 45 days prior to the next Board meeting.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Applications must include a description of the project or initiative and the extent of the commitment requested from NPMC including full costs breakdown (multi-year format if applicable). If the application is from a public sector, a municipal/band council resolution in support must be provided.

Projects requesting more than \$250,000 in funding are required to include a business plan with their application. Projects requesting less than \$250,000 are not required to include a business plan, but one may be requested at a later date. All applicants must provide a list of funding received or expected by all partner organizations that are related to the proposed project. Applications will be assessed based on factors such as:

- Level of significance to NPMC's business and long-term health of NPMC's management area, economic impact to the local forestry sector including jobs created and/or retained
- Alignment with NPMC's Strategic Plan and the objects listed in the OFTMA (visit NPMC's website for more information)
- Project lead resides in one of the eligible communities
- Appropriate documentation to confirm project support
- The proposed project, at the sole opinion and discretion of the NPMC Board, should not unreasonably impact existing businesses negatively within the NPMC management area
- Adherence to the application guidelines

Projects intended to identify capacity building and investment opportunities are only considered for funding when the applicant demonstrates the ability to support next steps in project implementation (i.e. through a business plan).

NFMC's Objects (as per the Ontario Forest Tenure Modernization Act)

1. To hold forest resource licences and manage Crown forests in a manner necessary to provide for the sustainability of Crown forests in accordance with the Crown Forest Sustainability Act, 1994 and to promote the sustainability of Crown forests.
2. To provide for economic development opportunities for aboriginal peoples.
3. To manage its affairs to become a self-sustaining business entity and to optimize the value from Crown forest resources while recognizing the importance of local economic development.
4. To market, sell and enable access to a predictable and competitively priced supply of Crown forest resources.
5. To carry out such other objects as may be prescribed by regulation.
