



## OVERVIEW

NFMC's Scholarships Program is intended to highlight NFMC's commitment to communities within and surrounding the management area by providing financial assistance through scholarships to eligible students attending colleges or universities in approved programs.

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE UNDER THE PROGRAM?

NFMC's Scholarships Program offers a total of sixteen scholarships to students graduating secondary school and entering or currently enrolled in a skilled trade, college, or university level program. Preference will be given to students enrolling in Forestry, Forestry Technician, Geographical Information System (GIS) or Natural Sciences programs.

The NFMC Scholarships Program has been separated into the following stream levels:

### Stream Level 1

- Students graduating from secondary school in an eligible community and enrolled in a college or university level program.
- Ideal candidates have contributed to their community in a volunteer or participatory capacity.
- Preference will be given to students who complete a compelling personal letter.

### Stream Level 2 and 3

- Students from eligible communities in a college, university, or graduate program.
- Students enrolled in a skilled trades program.
- Students should be enrolled in full-time forestry, GIS, or natural science program.

## ELIGIBILITY

Eligible applicants must be from a municipality or First Nation community located within or surrounding the NFMC management area.

To qualify, applicants must be residents or students in one of the following communities:

## ATTENTION FORESTRY STUDENTS!

NFMC is proud to support future Foresters through our new Recurring Scholarship Initiative. Beginning in Fall 2026, eligible students entering a post-secondary forestry program are guaranteed to receive a \$3,000 entrance scholarship upon approval of a complete application.

If you continue in your program, you will also be eligible for a renewable scholarship of \$2,000 in your second year and in third and fourth year, if applicable.

In addition, as of Fall 2026, current post-secondary students already enrolled in approved forestry programs may also qualify for the renewable scholarship.

### Please note:

NFMC's Recurring Scholarship Initiative is exclusively available for post-secondary forestry programs. Natural resource programs such as natural sciences or GIS, are not guaranteed through this initiative in subsequent years, but these students are encouraged to apply to the Stream 2 and 3 scholarship opportunities. ## FUNDING

A total of sixteen scholarships are available on an annual basis across all stream levels:

- Ten scholarships of \$3,000 to graduating students from local secondary schools
- Three scholarships of \$2,000 to students enrolled in an eligible college or skilled trades program
- Three scholarships of \$2,000 to students enrolled in an eligible university program

## TIMELINES

Stream level 1: deadline for applications is May 1st.

Stream level 2 and 3: deadline for applications is June 30th.

Successful applicants will receive their scholarship following submission of the program proof of enrollment.

## APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Applications must include a personal letter explaining why the applicant would be a good candidate for a scholarship from NFMFC. Application letters received in the package will be evaluated based on their clarity, organization, overall quality and completeness. At a minimum, this letter should include details regarding:

- Personal qualities
- Financial need
- Academic achievement (ie :Honour roll, awards, etc)
- Participation in extracurricular activities
- Personal goals
- Personal or academic connection to the NFMFC area

As well, application packages must also include:

- A completed application form
- A letter of recommendation from a teacher or professor
- The applicant's academic transcript
